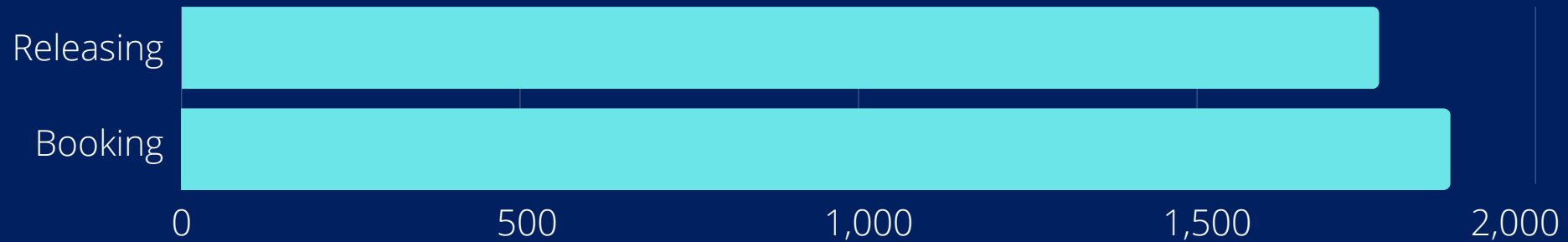

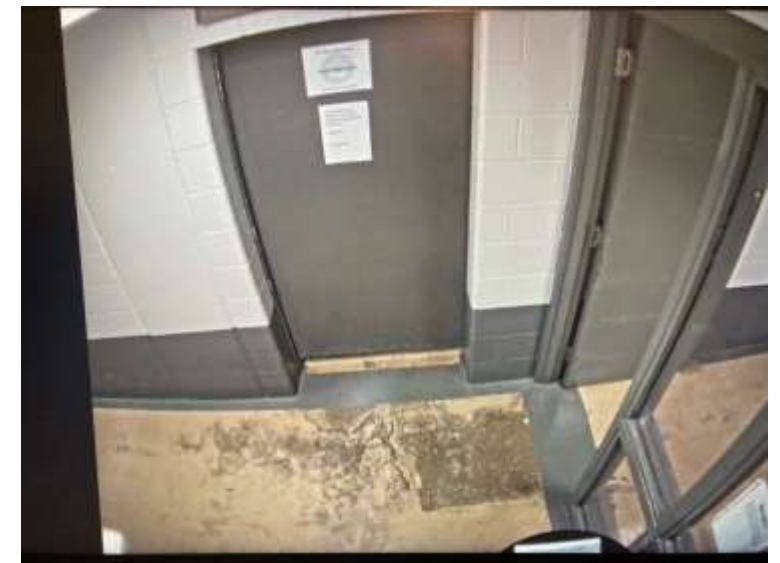
# FACILITY SECURITY CAMERA SYSTEM

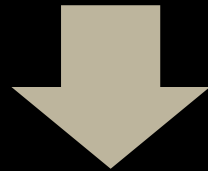

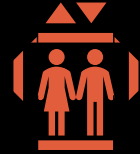
