- 333 total employees

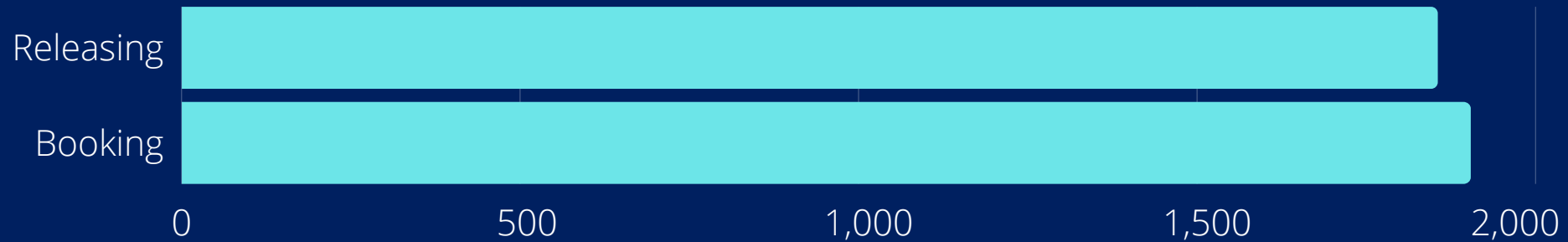
EMPLOYEE RAISE PROPOSAL

MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT AGREEMENT

We have entered into an agreement with Oklahoma Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services and Turn Key Health to provide mental health services to detainees on the list for mental health evaluations. This is the first partnership of its kind in Oklahoma.

Goals:

- Start treatment early
- Put detainee on a treatment path before they transfer to Vinita
- Combining resources to help detainee gain competence

Diversion Liaison staff are currently providing services on site at the jail Monday through Saturday from 6:30 a.m. until midnight.

Goals:

- Reduce jail population
- Reduce recidivism rates



CALM WATERS PARTNERSHIP

We have partnered with Calm Waters to provide free grief support services to detainees beginning in 2023

- ❑ Once a week for nine weeks
- ❑ 4 groups: 2 for men, 2 for women
- ❑ 10 detainees in each group
- ❑ Free of charge
